During his residency, he also had extensive training in anesthesia, which enabled him to attain his general anesthesia certificate in California and Colorado. After discovering his passion for aesthetic surgery, Dr. Dastoury pursued further subspecialty training in facial & body cosmetic surgery in order to provide the best aesthetic care for his patients. He completed another full year in general cosmetic surgery through the American Academy of Cosmetic Surgery fellowship program in Southern California.
